Sutton Cricket Club 5th/6th June Round Up!

The 1st XI lost an astonishing game at Cheam Road to Stoke d'Abernon: *Mike Woods' in depth report here* – www.thethirdman.uk

The 2nds won at Chertsey by 135 runs. Sutton made 208 for 6 off their 50 overs with Steve Dolben (51) and Matt Gardner (49 not out) top scoring. Chertsey could not contain the Sutton bowlers and slipped to just 73 all out in 32 overs with Connor Griffin (4 for 14) the pick of the crop.....continued on page 3.

The History of Valley End Cricket Club



The Cricket Club has been a part of Valley End life for over 125 years.

The idea for a club seems to have originated with the local church, possibly planned as an alternative to the Brickmaker's Arms.

A board in the clubhouse commemorates those who have given "special help and assistance." The names include those of two vicars of St. Saviour's, The Rev. T. J. James, and the Rev. N. Edmunds. But maybe they were also keen cricketers; after all James and Edmunds, and the Rev. Richmond, also served as club presidents.

Local benefactors were involved in setting up and running the Club. These included the Leschallas family from Highams, and the Christies from Ribsden.

The first problem facing the cricketers was to find a pitch. A plan to use a piece of common land behind the church failed after a lot of effort had been expended on it. Finally, Mr. J. A. Tyler of Woodlands, (later known as Windlesham Park), provided some ground. This was the start of a long connection between this estate and the Club. Mr Tyler was a prominent local figure. He was elected MP for Chertsey in 1903, but unfortunately, he had to resign the following year. He had speculated on the Stock Exchange and was declared bankrupt. This did not break his connection with the Cricket Club, and he was Club Captain from 1914 – 16, but he had to move from Woodlands. The new owner of the estate charged rent of £6 per season. It was a huge sum for Valley End and represented half their annual income.

Not only that, but after 1907 he wanted his pitch back. The Cricket Club would have been homeless but for the support of Leschallas family, who simply invited them down the road to Highams.

During World War 1 the pitch was ploughed up, and many members were called up for military service.

After the war, A. P. Henderson, of Windlesham Park, let them return to the ground. This family were committed to the Club for years. Three of them later became Club Presidents. They seem to have let the Club have the ground rent free.

Despite this, finance was always a problem. Various fundraising efforts were made; in the 1920s whist drives were popular. There seemed to be so many demands. A trip to Mellow in 1926 seemed likely to be an expensive outing, until Mr. Sturt of Valley End lent his lorry.

The Cricket Club was established as a part of the local community. Members were often part of the local sporting fraternity, such as Edward Coombs, member of the Cricket and Football Clubs, or William Godfrey, a cricketer who also played Table Tennis at Christ Church.

After World War 2, A. P. Henderson's widow, now Lady Wilson, became President. At the same time, the Secretary and Acting Treasurer was Jim Binks. Under his auspices Valley End finally bought its own ground from Lady Wilson for £200 in 1954. He is commemorated in the Jim Binks Pavilion.

In 1946, Lady Wilson had sold neighbouring land to Farmer Dudley Glanfield. He seems to have been fiercely protective of his boundaries. It may be no coincidence that a fence was built between the two properties, confirming what belonged to the Cricket Club.

Valley End was a friendly local club. Tony Lovejoy remembers the players coming not only from Valley End but also from Chobham, Woking and Windlesham. Most of them had bikes, and only one or two had cars. If fixtures were at a distance, taxis could be hired from Taylor's of Updown Hill Windlesham to transport the players.

After the matches at Valley End the teas were served in the Institute. Ladies such as Mrs Gladys Lovejoy and Lilian Millard would prepare the food. Joan Weymouth recalls cucumber sandwiches, and small jars of sweet peas on the tables.

The Valley End teas became legendary. Visiting teams looked forward to playing Valley End and relishing the lavish tea afterwards.

Valley End Cricket Club remains a local club, and a good one. In 2008 they played at Lords in the Village Cup Final. And won!



The Club celebrated their 125th Anniversary Celebration and Pavilion Grand Opening on Sunday 9th August 2020. The brand-new pavilion features full changing facilities, bar, and kitchen for refreshments and plenty of social spaces for players and guests to mingle whilst enjoying the beautiful game!

David Gower, former England captain, officially opened the pavilion at midday on Sunday 9th August and shared a 'Life in Cricket' talk for all guests. Later in the day, a Festival of Cricket across the three cricket pitches took place, including matches with the Marylebone Cricket Club, as well as games involving the club's Youth and Social cricket teams.

Valley End Cricket Club is at the heart of the local community with over 250 junior members, including 20 girls and a disability team (the Rascals). We play a highly competitive level of cricket with five league teams playing in the upper reaches of the Surrey Championship, with overseas players and professional coaching.

continued from page 1.) The 3rd XI skipper, Chat Premasinghe, had a fine day as Sutton beat Streatham & Marlborough by 17 runs at Holmwood Close. With the bat, he top scored with 85 and Gagan Erra (53) and Dylan Paskaran (48) offered good support in a total of 266 for 8 in 50 overs. At 173 for 1, the visitors were in the box seat but Premasinghe took 6 for 34 in two spells to turn the game on it's head.

The 4th XI consolidated their top of the league position with a good 6th wicket win at Ockley under stand in skipper, Dan Krayenbrink. The hosts scored 171 for 7 off their 40 overs and Sutton were wobbling at 61 for 4 in reply. But 62 from Shravan Ganesh and 48 from keeper Johnny Rosenthal ensured a comfortable enough win.

The 5th XI had a good win at Battersea Ironsides (more on this soon).

On Sunday, the trust team won by 65 runs at Cheam Road against Beddington in a match made remarkable by featuring 53 wides. Sutton posted 205 for 9 with Gagan Erra (67) claiming a second half century of the weekend. The visitors were always well up with the rate but could not build any partnerships and they succumbed in just 29 overs.

Sutton Ladies had an 8 wicket win over Walton who fielded just 9 players at Holmwood Close. The tardy Zaresh Rehman took 5 for 14 for Sutton.

The Club XI lost at Epsom.

Richard Spillers reviews a gloriously sunny Week Five of the AJ Fordham Surrey Championship 1st Division action.

Hugo Darby (51), Lloyd Paternott (72no) and Will Harris (67) sped the Wandsworth side to 287-8 – leg-spinner Elliot Green's action-packed 10 overs returning 5-70 – only for Todd Hutcheson (76) and James Crosthwaite (93) to put Camberley on track for a first victory of the season in a third-wicket alliance worth 131. But after being split at 226, they saw Spencer take back control to win by nine runs.

Previous joint-leaders Sutton crashed to a shock home defeat, despite having bowled out Stoke d'Abernon for 103, which owed much to Robbie Blackburn's 33 down the order. Sutton plummeted to 45-8 and although Dan Edwards counterattacked for 31, his side were dismissed for 91 as Ben Townsend and Toby Tarrant claimed four wickets apiece.

Malden Wanderers moved over them and into second place thanks to a 37-run success against Valley End, Zac Elkin's 110 out of 246 -5 the main reason. And Guildford had opener Oli Soames's unbeaten 102 spearheading their march to an eight-wicket victory over Chipstead, Coulsdon & Walcountians, adding an unbroken 86 with his brother Jason (32no). Surrey Academy off-spinner Shoaib Bashir's 4-34 was the main factor behind CCW sliding from 94-2 to 182-9.
